Pre-anesthetic testing consent: Our caring staff members want to ensure your pet's wellbeing at all times. Our doctor will perform a comprehensive exam before anesthetizing your pet; however, many disorders of the kidneys, liver, blood system or other organs cannot be detected without some kind of blood work. That's why we strongly recommend performing a pre-surgical screening before anesthesia is administered. If you haven't already done so, shall we perform these blood tests in —house prior to your pet's procedure? To help us provide the safest anesthetic protocol we can, we recommend a blood profile (chemistries & CBC) that can be done in hospital. The
