Another way to help reduce the risk of anesthesia is to perform an electrocardiogram before we administer any drugs. We can do that here in hospital and have a cardiologist review it within 20 minutes via telemedicine. It is a great screening tool for all ages, but we especially recommend it for all animals over 7 years of age.

Consent to perform extractions and other necessary procedures:

Many times a thorough dental exam cannot be completed until your pet is under anesthesia. Each tooth is carefully evaluated by the veterinarian to determine the best treatment. To help avoid surprise charges, a staff member can call you to update the estimate during the procedure if additional services are needed. We recommend addressing all problems today if we can to avoid scheduling another procedure and undergoing additional anesthesia. Please mark the response below:

Pre-anesthetic testing consent:

Our caring staff members want to ensure your pet's well-being at all times. Our doctor will perform a comprehensive exam before anesthetizing your pet; however, many disorders of the kidneys, liver, blood system or other organs cannot be detected without some kind of blood work. That's why we strongly recommend performing a pre-surgical screening before anesthesia is administered. If you haven't already done so, shall we perform these blood tests in-house prior to your pet's procedure? To help us provide the safest anesthetic protocol we can, we recommend a blood profile (chemistries & CBC) that can be done in hospital. The additional charge is **\$90.77 to \$140.35** depending on your pet's age.
